Pork SA received direct 2022/23 funding from the PIF for 2 major projects in the 2022/2023 financial year – being the co-funding of the Biosecurity Officer with PIRSA and the Ron Lienert Memorial Scholarship Award given to an Honours student at Adelaide University.

Pork SA's operating budget (\$109,211) and a suite of PIF projects (\$17,990) were supported by Pork SA's internal funds for 2022-23 from COVID-19 related underspends for 2020/21 and 2021/22 that allowed these funds to be carried forward into the same project budget lines in 2022/23, for activities previously approved by the Minister.

As a reconciliation, the following Carry-forward funds were available from the prior 2 years Funding Reports – these 2 Reports are attached as Attachment 1 and Attachment 2.

- Attachment 1: Report for FY 2021 showing unspent/carryover funds of \$144,849
- Attachment 2: Report for FY 2022 showing unspent/carryover funds of \$88,049

Transport Biosecurity Infrastructure Project

A further payment for the Transport Biosecurity Infrastructure Project of \$175,000 from the Pig Industry Fund was received from PIRSA bringing the total to \$925,000.

This additional \$175,000 was not matched by SA Finance Authority as for previous grants under the Regional Growth Fund.

Payment to each abattoir will be on completion of their Project, respectively. The Expiry Date of the Project has been extended to 31 December 2024 for both parties.

Payment of \$500,000 to Big River Pork is budgeted for payment in 2023/24.

Payment of these funds will be included in PIFs annual project reporting and published annually on the Pork SA website accordingly.

In summary – as of 30 June 2023, \$500,000 plus \$425,000 = \$925,000 has been received from PIF and is awaiting disbursement to the 2 Abattoirs on confirmation of the full project completion.

- Due to Covid, several PIF projects could not go ahead, were delayed or were limited in scope. These funds will be carried into 2021/22 (\$54,361).
- The underspend in the operating budget (\$45,666) was largely due to African Swine Fever which was underspent by \$29,467. There were also less meetings, industry days, travel and committee meeting expenses due to Covid. These funds will be carried over to 2021/22
- Contingency and other small projects, also affected by Covid, will carry into 2021/22 (\$44,822).
- In lieu of the underspend Pork SA has not included any contingencies, and operating budget has been reduced in the approved PIF budget for 2021/22.

- The underspend in the operating budget (\$27,112) was due to the impact of Covid on meetings, industry days, travel and committee meeting expenses. These funds will be carried over to 2022/23.
- Delays to the start of the biosecurity office position led to an underspend of \$47,988. These funds will be carried over to 2022/23.
- Due to Covid, several PIF projects could not go ahead, were delayed or were limited in scope. These funds will be carried into 2022/23 (\$12,977).
- There was an additional \$28 overspend in the RLMSF (\$12,528 vs \$12,500)

In lieu of the underspend over the last two years, Pork SA has not requested funds for contingencies, continuing PIF projects or operating for the approved PIF budget for 2022/23.

Payment for the Transport Biosecurity Infrastructure Project of \$750,000 from the Pig Industry Fund was received from PIRSA. Payment to each abattoir will be on completion of their Project, respectively. The Expiry Date of the Project has been extended to 30 June 2024 for both parties. These project funds paid in advance are now identified in the balance sheet, instead of appearing as profit. Payment of these funds will be included in PIFs annual project reporting and published annually on the Pork SA website accordingly.
